## FOSSIL FUN

Las Vegas Territory is now home to Nevada's newest state park - [Ice Age Fossils State Park](#) in North Las Vegas, Nevada. Located next to Tule Springs Fossil Beds National Monument, this 315-acre park is renowned for its fossils from Pleistocene megafauna, complex geology, and history of scientific investigation. It was once home to now extinct mammals such as Columbian mammoths, American lions, camelops, dire wolves, and ground sloths.



The new state park features 3 miles of trails including a .3 mi Megafauna trail featuring sculptures of the historic animals that once inhabited the area. Additionally, guests can stop by the new modern visitor center to view natural history exhibits including some of the fossils dug up on-site such as a 3 ft. Mammoth Tusk. The park will be open on weekends from 8 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. Children age 12 and younger can enter for free, there is a \$3 admission fee for all others.

## BOULDER CITY ADVENTURE CENTER MOVES FORWARD

Plans are moving forward with The Boulder City Adventure Center, located at the corner of Nevada Way and Boulder City Parkway. Upon completion, this will be your gateway to outdoor adventure in the Las Vegas Territory and beyond. Up to 18 tourism operators who offer various activities such as kayak and helicopter tours, hike and bike excursions, and more, will share a space where tourists can check-in for their adventure.

## NATIONAL PARKS RESERVATIONS

If you're planning a trip to Lake Mead National Recreation Area, card is now king when it comes to paying for entry and other fees. Earlier this year the park transitioned to a cashless entry system and now requires electronic card payments for entrance, lake use, and campground fees. Advance campground reservations, as well as first-come, first-served sites, will be available online only through [recreation.gov](https://www.recreation.gov). 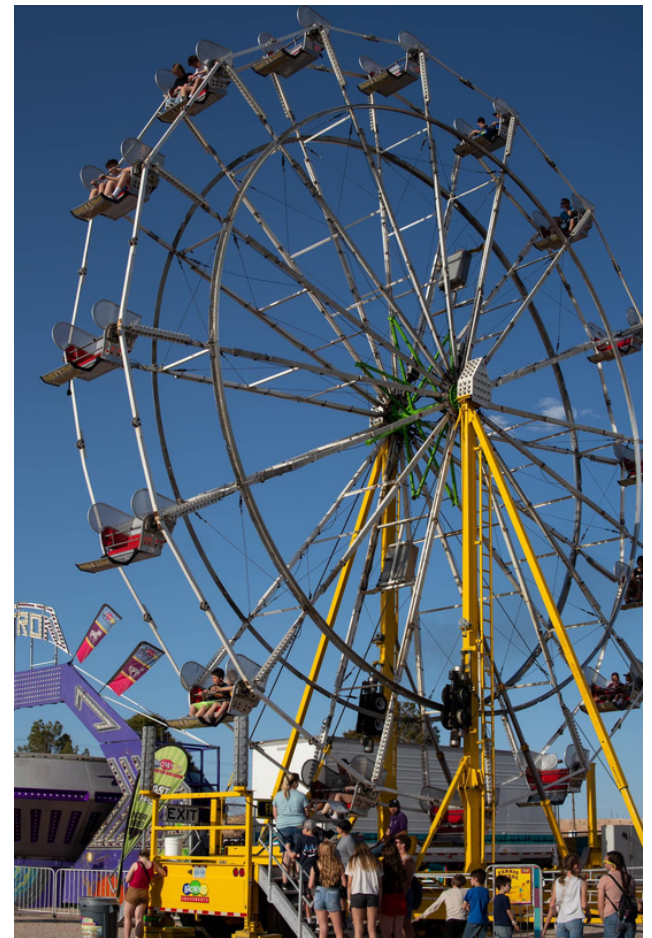

# LAS VEGAS TERRITORY

## WHAT IS LAS VEGAS TERRITORY?

Las Vegas Territory is a membership-based, non-profit organization established in 1984 by the Nevada Commission on Tourism and the support of the Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority (LVCVA). The purpose of the organization is to increase the number of first-time and returning visitors by creating an awareness of the outlying tourism entities, cultural activities, special events, scenic attractions, and the recreation and historical areas of Clark County, Nevada. **What's New Las Vegas Territory** is underwritten by a Travel Nevada grant. ## WHERE IS LAS VEGAS TERRITORY?

Las Vegas Territory encompasses the southern region of the Silver State, and includes Boulder City, Downtown Las Vegas, Goodsprings, Henderson, Las Vegas, Laughlin, Jean, Mesquite, Moapa Valley, and Primm – and all of the cool places in between.

**Mesquite** is known for its eight championship golf courses and plenty of UTV trails. Its close proximity to southern Utah's National Parks makes it a great base camp to unpack your bags for overnight.

**Moapa Valley** features more than 200 mi. of recreational trails in the Logandale Trail System and is the perfect place to stay while exploring Valley of Fire and Gold Butte National Monument.

**Boulder City** was originally built to house workers of the nearby Boulder Dam (later renamed Hoover Dam). Small town life is well-preserved in this quaint town featuring museums, antiques and dining.

**Laughlin** is located along the picturesque Colorado River where guests can enjoy water attractions, hiking, labyrinths, strolling the Riverwalk, golf, gaming, amazing accommodations, dining, entertainment, and other outdoor activities.

**Primm/Goodsprings/Jean** are a collection of small towns close to southern Nevada's border. Originally a hot spot for mining, today they serve as a popular rest stop between Las Vegas and California.

**Henderson** is the second largest city in Nevada. With miles of walking and biking trails, a bird preserve, and Lake Las Vegas, the city prides itself on small town values with big city efficiencies.

**Downtown Las Vegas** is where the neon lights of Las Vegas got their start. In the past decade the area has undergone a renaissance with the growth of The Arts District and Fremont East areas.
